District 5190 is pleased to offer our 13th Residential_Rotary Eighth Grade Leadership Program (REGL), a special youth leadership program at Grizzly Creek Ranch in Portola, CA on **September 13-15,2024 (REGL I), and on September 20-22, 2024 (REGL II)** Cost is still being discussed as there was a loss last year. It is expected to run between \$1800-\$1900.00. Space is limited so when your club receives the “ Call Letter” to reserve your space please do so quickly and identify the school you are supporting as well as ho your club advisor to the school is going to be.

Background:

REGL was started in 2009 as a day program by the Rotary Clubs of Sparks and Sparks Centennial Sunrise, and four middle schools in Sparks. In 2011-2016 the Rotary Clubs of Alturas, Portola and several clubs in the Grass Valley/Auburn area expanded REGL to include a 3-day residential program to serve middle school students throughout our large District. Beginning in 2017, District 5190 offered two residential REGL sessions open to all District 5190 Rotary Clubs and their sponsored schools. Sadly, we took a break in 2020 and did not have our REGL camps due to Covid 19, but we reopened REGL in 2021.

Purpose:

The purpose of REGL is to provide high quality leadership training with a strong emphasis on ethics to select 8th grade students who have demonstrated leadership skills. Our aim is to provide these selected students with tools for the difficult choices that they face as they move into high school and beyond.

In addition, the program will instill in the participants the value of Service above Self, a core Rotary belief.

The students will participate in a character-building program provided by the Grizzly Creek Ranch Ropes Course, which focuses on leadership, effective communication, trust and cooperation. Utilizing adventure, personal commitments and shared insights, they will gain an increased sense of confidence in yourselves and in your team.

Attendance at RYLA is supported by fully paid scholarships provided by the generosity of the men and women Rotarians of the 95 clubs in Rotary Districts 5180 and 5190 and takes place at the superb educational retreat at the Grizzly Creek Ranch located near Portola, California.
