

PROFILE OF THE IDEAL GLOBAL GRANT SCHOLARSHIP CANDIDATE

The Rotary Foundation has identified the following traits (in no particular order) to be considered standard for any Rotary "ambassador of goodwill."

The ideal Global Grant Scholar Candidate:

_Possesses excellent leadership skills and potential
_Understands award obligations, especially attending Rotary meetings and projects
_Has a proven record of success in academics (at least C average) and/or vocation
_Is well-groomed and has a professional appearance
_Has demonstrated a personal commitment to community service
_Will participate in an orientation seminar provided by the club or district
Has well-defined and realistic goals
Possesses maturity and seriousness of purpose
_Accepts and practices the Rotary Four-Way Test
_Adheres to deadlines

NOTE: Global Grant Scholarships include grant funds, and Rotary has a conflict-of-interest provision that states that individuals who fall in any of the categories listed below cannot receive grant funds:

- Rotarian, including honorary Rotarian
- Employee of a club, district, or other Rotary Entity, or of Rotary International
- Spouse, lineal descendant (child or grandchild by blood, legal adoption, or marriage without adoption), spouse of lineal descendants, or ancestor (parent or grandparent by blood) or persons in the above categories.
- Employee of an agency, organization, or institution that partners with The Rotary Foundation or Rotary International
- Former Rotarian or honorary Rotarian who has terminated membership within the preceding 36 months
- Person who has a familial relationship to a former Rotarian, honorary Rotarian, for a period of 36 months after termination of family member's membership.
